#### **4. Competition Rules and Technical Information**

FIBA Regulations which have been in force since 01 January 2005 and the Black Sea Games Statute are valid in the Black Sea Games Basketball matches.

According to the Black Sea Games Statute, Basketball matches will be played with at least the participation of 4 countries.

Any problem which is not mentioned here shall be dealt with as follows:

- Black Sea Games Statute shall be valid in general issues
- FIBA Regulations shall be valid in technical issues

#### **4.1. Participation**

Matches shall be played between junior male players born in 1989 and later. To participate in the Games, the players must have the right to compete in their national teams.

Prior to competitions in technical meetings, the ages shall be checked and approved according to their passport information. Besides, each delegation shall submit FIBA-Europe licenses and FIBA-Europe approved lists of players to the Organizing Committee.

#### **4.2. Competition Format**

Each country plays against the other countries in its own group once. The order of the games will be as follows;

<b>Day 1</b>	<b>Day 2</b>	<b>Day 3</b>
1 – 2	3 – 1	2 – 3

The best placed (the first placed) countries in each group and the best 2<sup>nd</sup> placed country of three groups (total four countries) will qualify for the semi-final and final.

Remaining two 2<sup>nd</sup> placed countries and two best 3<sup>rd</sup> placed country of three groups (total four countries) will play for classification games. (5 – 8 place)

Remaining country will be announced as 9<sup>th</sup> place after qualifying games.

The best placed countries will be determined as follows;

1. Win/Loss percentage



2. If more countries have the same win/loss percentage, goal average will be used as the next criteria as stated in Section D of the Official Basketball Rules.

The final and classification games will be determined by draw after the last game of qualifying games. (Two countries from the same group qualify for next round will not meet in the semi-final and the first leg of the classification games.)

### **4.3. Competition Management**

Turkish Basketball Federation is responsible for all the technical preparations and arrangements regarding the Basketball matches in the Games.

#### **4.3.1. International Technical Delegate**

Competitions shall be under the supervision of a Technical Delegate appointed by International Federation. This TD shall have sufficient experience and qualification for this duty.

#### **4.3.2. Technical Board**

Turkish Basketball Federation is responsible for all technical preparations and arrangement regarding the Basketball matches.

### **4.4. Drawing of Lots**

Drawing of lots took place on 02 May 2007 in İstanbul Olympic House with the attendance of the Heads of Delegations of the respective countries.

The countries are ranked according to the results from the FIBA Europe list of Youth Categories – Men

- Russia (1)
- Turkey (4)
- Greece (11)
- Ukraine (13)
- Georgia (24)
- Romania (34)
- Albania (36)
- Azerbaijan
- Moldova



The seedings are as follows:

All countries taking part in the Black Sea Games will be drawn according to the above seeding into 3 groups of 3 countries each.

According to the result of the drawing of lots, 3 groups are composed as follows

### Groups

At the end of the group matches, separate drawing of lots shall take place for the finals and classification matches.

### 4.5. Scoring System

For the team classifications, firstly the winning and losing ratio of the teams shall be considered. If there is equality, then the team which totally scores more shall be counted as winner, if there is equality again, finally there shall be a drawing among teams.

### 4.6. Uniforms

All the uniforms and other equipment shall comply with FIBA-Europe Regulations.

Each team shall bring two sets of uniforms one is light and one is dark colours.

### 4.7. Balls

FIBA –Europe approved balls shall be used. 12 balls shall be ready to be used in each training and match.

### 4.8. Statistics

In each competition the statistics shall be recorded and teams shall be informed at the end of the periods, in half times and at the end of the matches.



In addition to this, at the end of every competition day the whole statistical information and scores shall be delivered to teams.  
The content of statistical reports shall comply with FIBA-Europe Standards.

Depending on the statistical data recorded, at the end of the competitions, the best scorer, the best rebound holder, the best assist player and the most valuable players shall be determined.

#### 4.9. Trainings

On 02 July 2007, for each team, there shall be a training session of at least 1 hour in competition halls.

On competition days, the teams shall be given of 1 hour training sessions in competition halls.

The first day training session shall be planned considering the arrival times of the delegations in Trabzon city; others shall be planned considering the competition programmes of teams and shall be delivered to teams in technical meetings.

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## 5. Competition and Training Halls

### 5.1. Competition Halls

Basketball matches and training in Black Sea Games shall take place in the two sport halls; 19 Mayıs Sport Hall and KTÜ Hasan Polat Sport Hall.

## 6. Composition of the Delegation

### 6.1. Composition of the Team

Basketball Teams shall be composed as follows:

- 1 Team Leader
- 3 Coach
- 1 Equipment Carrier
- 12 Players ( Boys )

### 6.2. Extra Delegates

Extra delegates are not allowed in the 1st Black Sea Games.

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## **7. Entries and Technical Meetings**

### **7.1 Entries**

Entries to the First Black Sea Games shall be done in four steps as follows:

#### **7.1.1. Pre - entries**

First entry forms were received from the related countries on 19 January 2007.

#### **7.1.2. Entries by number**

Second entry forms will be received on 09 March 2007.

#### **7.1.3. Entries by number and name ( Final entries )**

In Final entry forms, the countries shall inform both their numbers and names of the participants by 08 June 2007.

#### **7.1.4. Entry confirmation**

Entry confirmation shall be done during the technical meeting of each sport.

### **7.2. Technical Meetings**

The technical meeting for basketball competitions shall be held on 02 July 2007 in The Games Village.

Technical and Appeal Committees shall be formed in the Technical Meeting to be held according to the agenda and valid FIBA-Europe Regulations.

The Head of delegations and a person who can speak and write English shall participate in the meetings. As the ages of players shall be approved, the team representatives shall bring the team lists together with the passports.



## **8. Jury of Referees**

Technical and Appeal Committees shall be formed in the Technical Meeting to be held according to the agenda and valid FIBA-Europe Regulations.

There shall be two officiating referees. Each delegation shall bring one (1) highest degree referee (preferably international licence holder). If the teams fail to bring any referee, Turkish referees shall be appointed.

There shall be four persons officiating in each competition as score keeper, assistant score keeper, time keeper, and 24 seconds time keeper. Desk officials shall be local.

## **9. Arbitration and Protests**

FIBA Regulations and Black Sea Games Statute are valid in the Black Sea Games Basketball matches.

## **10. Anti-doping**

During the Games, doping tests shall be carried out randomly. Moreover, blood and EPO analysis shall be done.

## **11. Medical Services**

Necessary medical services shall be supplied at the following venues during the Games:

1. At the competition venues
2. At the training venues
3. At the Games Village

## **12. Prize Ceremony**

The prize ceremony shall take place at the end of the final match in the competition hall. The FIBA-Europe Regulations shall apply for The Prize Ceremony.

The first ranked team shall receive a cup, players and officials shall receive medals. The players and officials of second and third ranked teams shall be awarded with medals.



The best scorer, the best rebound holder, the best assist player and the most valuable players shall receive plaques according to the statistical data recorded in the matches.

The first, second and third ranked teams have to attend the prize ceremony with one style appropriate uniforms.

The National Anthems of the countries shall be brought by respective Delegation Heads.
